

“H. ALLAN LIPSITZ MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP”

NEW APPLICANT INFORMATION SHEET

H. Allan Lipsitz taught English to seniors in Milford Mill High School for 13 years, from 1964 to 1977. He inspired and motivated hundreds of students during his many years of teaching. He was a dynamic teacher and a yearbook faculty advisor whose creativity was boundless. He inspired a generation of Milford Mill students to care about literature, high-quality writing and critical analysis. He was extremely generous with his time and spent countless hours assisting his students. Unfortunately, Mr. Lipsitz passed away in February 2007.

Education was of the highest importance to Mr. Lipsitz. He received his B.A and an M.A. from the University of Maryland and two master's degrees from The Johns Hopkins University. After teaching at Milford Mill High School, Mr. Lipsitz became an academic adviser in continuing studies at Towson University, where hundreds of college students benefited from his brilliance as a teacher and mentor. He also created and directed the Elderhostel program for many years at Towson University. For the past nine years, he was director of adult education at Beth El Congregation, where he touched the lives of countless members of the greater Baltimore Community.

Delegate Dana Stein was a student in Mr. Lipsitz's class at Milford Mill from 1975-1976. Through this scholarship program, Delegate Stein wishes to honor Mr. Lipsitz's memory.

What is the H. Allan Lipsitz Memorial Scholarship?

Delegate Stein's H. Allan Lipsitz Memorial Scholarship is awarded to recognize students for their academic excellence and superior performance in high school. Criteria for the scholarship include academic achievement in high school (especially in English and writing), community service activities and financial need.

Who is eligible?

Students seeking higher education, undergraduate or graduate, currently living in the 11th District are eligible. Recipients must enroll in an accredited Maryland college or university for the academic year 2012-2013.

How do I apply?

1. Create a Student Login Profile through the Maryland College Aid Processing System [MD CAPS <https://mdcaps.mhec.state.md.us>]
2. Complete the Application Form with parent or guardian's signature.
2. Submit **either** an official **or** un-official transcript
3. Please submit a resume that includes your non-weighted GPA (including grades in English/literature and writing), your career interests and any scholastic awards. Also describe any work experience and community service projects.
4. Submit an essay of 500 words or less that discusses your values or career/academic interests. If you have a previously written essay, that is acceptable.
5. Include two letters of recommendation. One letter must be from a current or past professor.
6. **Application Must Be Postmarked By: Friday, March 30, 2012.**

ONLY SUBMIT COMPLETE APPLICATIONS; All required materials must be submitted at the same time.
